The Condamine Bell is also known as the *Bullfrog Bell*.




The Boonarga Cactoblastis Memorial Hall is the only hall in the southern hemisphere honouring an insect.

DINGO BARRIER FENCE

In our region is the northern end of the world's longest fence, the Dingo Barrier Fence.



Barakula State Forest is the largest state forest in the Southern Hemisphere and supplies much of Queensland's Cypress Pine timber resource.



With Australia's second largest road network, Council is responsible for the maintenance and upgrade of almost 7,600 kilometres of rural and urban roads across the Western Downs.




Kaimkillenbun is the town with the longest single name in Queensland.






The Bunya Mountains are a living natural history museum - by age alone, the Bunya Mountains ridge dates back 30 million years.





Chinchilla is home to the Big Melon which stands more than 3m tall, almost 9m wide and weighs four tonnes. Travellers can't miss the giant slice of melon, located at the Chinchilla Visitor Information Centre, along the Warrego Highway.




COLOUR ME
